Travel Advice

Vaccination Advice

Whatever your travel destination, it is essential that all "routine vaccinations" such as Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio are up to date before you leave. Hepatitis A and Typhoid vaccinations may also be advised for some travel destinations or other vaccinations depending on your destination and plans.

Travel Check List

It is important to consider your health implications when travelling abroad by choosing your travel destination carefully when planning for a trip. With careful, forward planning you could be properly prepared and worry-free.

Passport, Money, Traveller's Cheques and Valuable

Remember to keep your passport, money and traveller's cheques in a safe place. Money belts are easy to wear and can be bought at most airports. When you are staying in a hotel, it is advisable to keep your valuables in a safe deposit box within the hotel. If you are backpacking leave a photocopy of your documents with someone at home, in case of an emergency.

Travelling with existing medical conditions

Ensure that you have sufficient medication for your journey collected in plenty of time, including oral contraception. If you need to carry needles or other drugs that could cause a problem at customs, please ask your GP to write a letter explaining their use. Please be aware of air-line restrictions regarding liquid medications. Always carry medication in your hand luggage and keep a copy of your repeat prescription in case you get stopped at customs.

Travel Immunisations that must be given as part of the NHS Service

The following immunisations for travel are part of the NHS Services, **no fee may be charged by the Practice** to a patient registered for NHS Services with the Practice:-

- Hepatitis A (infectious hepatitis) - first and second/booster dose (6-12 months after the first dose)
- Combined hepatitis A and B—all doses
- Typhoid—first and any booster doses
- Combined hepatitis A and typhoid—first dose (second dose is with Hepatitis A alone)
- Tetanus, diphtheria and polio as given in the combined Td/IPV vaccine
- Cholera

Travel Immunisations that cannot be given as an NHS Service

The following immunisations are therefore chargeable to the patient if they are required for travel:-

- Yellow Fever
- Japanese B Encephalitis
- Tick bone Encephalitis
- Rabies
